JPIFF Awards Nearly \$12,000 in Grants to Five Local Organizations

Trailblazers Program Rolls into Second Year; New Scholarships and Programs Debut in 2010

In 2010, the John Patrick Flanagan Foundation (JPIFF) strove to expand our reach into the local community. We found such opportunities in five Connecticut-based charities. All of our recipient organizations help children in critical, yet very different, ways. Here is some detail about the 2010 grant recipients – and how they are making a difference in the lives of children and their families around the state.

John Patrick Flanagan Trailblazers Program

In 2010, JPIFF renewed our commitment to the Connecticut Audubon Society (CAS) and funded the JPIFF Trailblazers field trip program for Bridgeport, CT, public school children for the second year in a row.

We are pleased to bring nature and science into the lives of so many urban children with our \$6,700 grant. The Trailblazers program was developed to enable second- through sixth-graders in our area to explore native Connecticut habitats and see live animals, complementing their existing science curriculum.

“The John Patrick Flanagan Trailblazers program is a unique and vital offering for inner city youth in our area,” said Nelson North, director of CAS Fairfield operations. “Getting outside into nature makes a huge difference in how children learn science – especially children who lack the financial resources to attend a field trip to Connecticut Audubon Society’s Fairfield Center. Last year, you could see the spark in the 575-plus children fortunate enough to attend the program. This year, we hope to reach even more.” *(continued on pg 4)*

Through the generosity of our contributors and volunteers, JPIFF fully achieved our goal of supporting programs and causes that pay tribute to John’s life and memory and made great strides in building our long-term endowment. With your support, JPIFF made a significant impact in our community throughout the course of 2010, including:

- Continuing our very successful *John Patrick Flanagan Trailblazers* program with the Connecticut Audubon Society to bring nearly 600 children from the Bridgeport Public School System to participate in field trips at the nature sanctuary where John loved to spend time with our children.
- Establishing The John Patrick Flanagan Foundation Memorial Scholarship at Fairfield High School; JPIFF also supported a scholarship in John’s name at Fairfield College Preparatory School.
- Providing funding to the Evergreen Network, an agency that describes itself as helping “the poorest of the poor” by providing supportive services for children and adults in the Greater Bridgeport area who are infected or affected by HIV/AIDS.
- Supporting the Bridgeport Youth Lacrosse program, where 40 at-risk children got the opportunity to learn John’s favorite sport on Saturday mornings.

JPPF Fundraising Highlights 2010

Because of the generosity of more than 400 hundred supporters, JPPF raised \$108,546 in 2010, our second year in operation. Your support has been a humbling and powerful endorsement of our mission. Here are some highlights from the past year.

ICR XCHANGE Raffle, Jan. 13, 2010

In January 2010, John's firm, ICR, Inc., dedicated the Annual ICR XChange conference to his memory. The ICR XChange is a nationally recognized conference that John helped start 13 years ago and is attended by more than 100 public companies and 1,500 members of the investment community. Last year, a raffle was held to benefit JPPF. Dozens of ICR clients and attending companies donated prizes ranging from a Fender Stratocaster guitar, to a private dinner for 12 prepared by the head chef for Ruth's Chris Steakhouse, elaborate gift baskets, and other prizes. The raffle raised nearly \$25,000 for JPPF. Thank you to ICR volunteers and our generous prize donors for this unique fundraising opportunity.

Team Flanagan Runs Fairfield Half Marathon and 5K Road Race, June 26, 2010

For the second year in a row, Team Flanagan had a fantastic turnout for the Fairfield Half Marathon and 5K Road Race. More than 110 runners, including Senator Richard Blumenthal, donned their green Team Flanagan t-shirts and competed. Their efforts raised more than \$36,000! We are so thankful to all of our 2010 runners for their enthusiastic participation and to their sponsors for their generosity.

Being blessed with an older brother is a fortunate situation. For me, having John Flanagan as my older brother of 16 months was the greatest thing that ever happened to me.

It's hard to capture the beauty of having such a relationship because the effects are all-encompassing. John and I were very close, and as children we did most everything together. We attended the same schools and the same summer camps. We shared a bedroom, chatting with each other before falling asleep. We played sports together in the backyard, at the park, on the playing fields, and on the basketball court. We engaged in acts of adventure and mischief together, and we partied together. John and I shared the honor of being best man at each other's weddings. We vacationed every summer with our families in Maine, and we spent countless holidays together at our folks' house. This list goes on and on. As I reflect on it all, it seems that through most of my life, I had John with me. If not physically by my side, always just a phone call away.

Our relationship was unique in that there was never any competition or resentment. Throughout my childhood and well into my adult life, John was the ultimate comrade. He was the greatest friend, and it was extremely reassuring to know he was always present, always there to support me and come to my defense. However, John never turned a blind eye – and if I was wrong in my actions, John would quietly guide me without judgment, helping me to understand the errors of my ways. He always did this in a thoughtful manner that let me know that our relationship would be unaffected, and that he would support me as we moved forward. John provided me with the purest form of unconditional love that a person can experience. It is my belief that unconditional love is the greatest gift that one person can bestow upon another, and my brother John provided me with a steady supply of this tremendous gift every day of my life. Daily, I set aside time to think about John, the memories we had together, the wonderful friendship we shared, and what a blessing he truly was both to me and to so many others. Sometimes this can be difficult and emotional, but it keeps him alive in my heart and close to me as a brother, allowing me to embrace and cherish our special love for each other.

2010 Grants (cont.)

Evergreen Network

JPPF made a \$2,000 grant to the Evergreen Network, Inc., an agency that provides supportive services specifically for children and adults in the Greater Bridgeport, CT, area who are infected or affected by HIV/AIDS. The Evergreen Network provides psychosocial services including support groups, teen mentorship, counseling, and emergency food.

Adaline De Marrais, Director of the Evergreen Network, said of the JPPF grant, "Our children's groups are having a very successful year with so much support. Your help has been critical for us."

Scholarships

In 2010, JPPF began to support the academic pursuits of local children through two scholarships:

1. The John Patrick Flanagan Memorial Scholarship at the High School Scholarship Foundation of Fairfield (HSSFF)

In 2010, JPPF established a \$1,000 scholarship to be awarded to a current student of Fairfield Warde High School who plans to attend a four-year college and demonstrates financial need. We are proud to create this scholarship as a fitting way to honor John in his hometown, at the school his siblings and his wife attended – and where his own children will continue their academic pursuits.

2. The John Patrick Flanagan Memorial Scholarship at Fairfield College Preparatory School

In 1982, John graduated from Fairfield College Preparatory School. Fifteen years later, he co-founded ICR, a strategic financial communications firm with two of his best high school buddies – Tom Ryan and the late Chad Jacobs. Today, the company is ranked as the top financial communications firm in the country.

With so much appreciation for the personal and professional opportunity they found together through Fairfield Prep, John, Tom, and Chad created a scholarship there in 2003 that would cover the full cost of tuition for a student demonstrating financial need. Larry Carroll, vice president for advancement at Fairfield Prep, said, "John, Tom, and Chad had all talked about the bonds they had formed as friends at Prep, and that this bond was one of the reasons they had decided to begin a professional relationship. It was heartwarming to know they created this scholarship to help make that same kind of opportunity possible for countless other young men."

After John's passing, ICR continued the scholarship, renaming it the John Patrick Flanagan Memorial Scholarship at Fairfield Prep. In 2010, JPPF was honored to make our first grant of \$1,000 to this scholarship for the 2011-2012 school year.

Bridgeport Youth Lacrosse (BYL)

The Bridgeport Youth Lacrosse program was founded in September 2007 with about 40 children participating.

In 2010, BYL served more than 200 Bridgeport children. Our \$1,000 grant enabled 40 children to participate in the winter 2010-2011 program, learning the game and honing their skills on Saturday mornings at the Cardinal Shehan Center in Bridgeport, CT.

Don Wilson, director of BYL, said, "I really would like to thank the John Patrick Flanagan Foundation for their generous gift. With this grant, BYL was able to give 40 at-risk youths in Bridgeport a chance to try a new sport: lacrosse."

The mission of BYL is "Striving to impact youth in the development of self-confidence, self-discipline, and dedication for the skills necessary to succeed in sports and in life."
